NCLEX Pharmacology Antidotes. Coumadin = Vitamin K. Benzodiazepines = Romazicon (Flumazenil) Magnesium Sulfate = Calcium Gluconate. Heparin = Protamine Sulfate. Tylenol = Mucomyst. Opiates = Narcotic analgesics, heroin morphine, Narcan (Naloxone) Cholinergic Meds = Atropine, pralidoxime (2-PAM) Digoxin = Digiband.
